# THE WESTEROS WING <br> The politics of "Game of Thrones."

This season on "Game of Thrones," Tyrion Lannis-ter-a salty dwarf with a Wildean wit-cuts a deal with some powerful slave owners on behalf of his boss, the flame-resistant abolitionist desert queen Daenerys. If they agree to stop funding regime change, they will get seven years to phase out slavery. Tyrion's aides, former slaves, object. "Slavery is a horror that should be ended at once," Tyrion shoots back. "War is a horror that should be ended at once. I can't do both today."

In the colossal, bloody, flawed, exhausting, occasionally intoxicating phenomenon that is "Game of Thrones," the best bits are often moments like this: seductive mini-meditations on politics that wouldn't be out of place in "Wolf Hall," if "Wolf Hall" had ice zombies, or "Veep," if "Veep" featured babies getting eaten by dogs. Season 6 , which ended on Sunday, to the usual celebration and fury, and with the usual viral memes, and with corpses mangled (I assume, since HBO didn't give me a screener), felt perversely relevant in this election year. It was dominated by debates about purity versus pragmatism; the struggles of female candidates in a male-run world; family dynasties with ugly histories; and assorted deals with various devils. George R. R. Martin surely didn't intend his blockbuster series of fantasy books, set in feudal Westeros (which I haven't read and, let's face it, probably won't read), to be an allegorical text for U.S. voters in 2016. But that's what you get with
 in this election year.
modern water-cooler dramas, which so often work as an aesthetic Esperanto that lets us talk about politics without fighting about the news.

Certainly, TV spent many years helping viewers to imagine what it might be like to elect Barack Obama: on shows as varied as the ultra-liberal "The West Wing" and the neocon " 24 ," we saw black or Latino male Presidents, often heroic and authoritative. (On "The West Wing," the cool upstart Santos was explicitly based on the young Obama.). Hillary Clinton hasn't had quite the same fictional fanfare. With a few exceptions, like "Madame Secretary," on CBS, the Hillary-inspired characters on modern dramas, from Mellie Grant to Alicia Florrick to Claire Underwood, might as well have been funded by the R.N.C.:

## Political cartoons usually have the shelf life of yogurt, yet many of Art Young's

 drawings from the early twentieth century remain fresh and hilariously witty-they seem to have been hatched just this morning. Young, one of the core editors and artists of The Masses, a socialist bohemian publication, didn't get lost in the trivia of daily news; he kept his eyes on the big drama of the ninety-nine per cent versus the one per cent.A jovial man who even had empathy for his enemies, Young had a winning sense of humor as well as a strong sense of social justice-some of his funniest drawings are about Hell. During the First World War, when Young was tried for treason alongside John Reed and Max Eastman, his colleagues at The Masses, the prosecuting attorney couldn't help stating, in his otherwise excoriating summation, that "everybody loves Art Young."A long overdue book celebrating Young's life and art—edited by Glenn Bray and Frank Young (no relation)comes out this week, from Fantagraphics.

After The Masses trial, in 1917, Young became too hot for comfort, yet many editors tried to find ways to use his astute and often conceptual cartoons in their mainstream publications. Two "Complex" images were part of a series drawn for the Saturday Evening Post.
"This Complex usually stays right where he is, because he doesn't know which way to jump. He is the sworn enemy of that positive, Go-Get Complex which is sometimes as destructive to the human conduct as his rival."

CONDENSED REGULAR 8/11 PT

After the government shut down The Masses, Young contributed to, and helped found, many other radical magazines, including The New Masses, the Communist, usually more dogmatic successor to The Masses. Young published three different books inspired by Dante's "Inferno." "Hell Up to Date: The Reckless Journey of R. Palasco Drant, Newspaper Correspondent, Through the Infernal Regions, As Reported by Himself" was his first book, published in 1894. Its success led to "Through Hell with Hiprah Hunt," in 1901.
"Art Young's Inferno: A Journey Through Hell Six Hundred Years After Dante," published in 1934, is considered one of Young's mas terpieces. This drawing was used as an exhibit in the government's prosecution of the editors of The Masses under the Espionage Act They were charged with "conspiracy to obstruct the recruiting and enlistment service of the U.S."
